# Citizenship Sunday

Voter Registration Instructions

- Take 10 minutes and review all material in this packet.
- Note the enclosed **Voter Registration Form**. More forms are available from Ohio Christian Alliance, or go to your County Board of Elections and pick up Voter Registration Postcards (Pick up approximately 50% of your church size.)
- Eligible Voters
  - 18 years old
  - US Citizen
  - Ohio resident
  - Has not been barred from voting due to a felony conviction
  - Has not been declared mentally incompetent by a court

### **Action Plan**

- It would be a great opportunity for this to be a God & Country Service *Citizenship Sunday*
- *Clergy* Please incorporate the Voter Registration Drive as a part of the service. It will not be as fruitful if this is casually mentioned from the pulpit and the voter registration forms left in the lobby.
- The clergy needs to ask for a show of hands of those who need to register to vote.
- Ushers can pass out Voter Registration Forms.
- Ask the church members to complete the Voter Registration Form, fold it in half, seal it and put it in the *Offering Basket*. It is important to recover forms during the service to maximize response.
- An appointed liaison from the clergy should collect all Voter Registration Forms and <u>hand</u> <u>deliver them to the County Board of Elections on Monday</u> morning after Citizenship Sunday.
- Church liaison or clergy complete enclosed <u>reporting form</u> and fax to the Ohio Christian Alliance office <u>Monday morning after Citizenship Sunday</u>.

### What a Church and Pastor Can and Can Not Do Legally

#### What A Church MAY DO

- Engage in Voter Registration that refrains from stressing a particular political party.
- Distribute Material that is educational to voters, but which refrains from favoring any particular candidate or party, such as the Christian Coalition Voter Guide.
- Conduct candidate or issues forums where each duly qualified candidate is invited and provided an equal opportunity to speak.
- Allow candidates or elected officials to speak at church services. Churches that allow only one candidate or a single political party's candidate to speak can be seen as favoring that candidate or party. No candidate should be prohibited from addressing a church if others running for the same office have been allowed to speak.
- A church can influence legislation through lobbying. A church may spend no more than an insubstantial amount of it's annual budget (5 percent is a safe amount) on direct lobbying activities.
- Contribute funds to citizen organizations such as Christian Coalition. The 5 percent rule applies here as well and is inclusive of all lobbying. Lobbying activities and contributions combined should not exceed 5 percent of the church's annual budget.
- Pastors may endorse candidates in their capacity as private citizens and may even allow their title to be used in that endorsement. The fact that a pastor is an employee of a church no way removes his right to free speech as a citizen of the United States.
- Pastors may participate fully in political committees that are independent of the church.

#### What A Church MAYNOT DO

- A pastor may not endorse candidates on behalf of the church. A pastor should not directly or indirectly endorse a candidate from the pulpit or otherwise in a church meeting.
- Contribute funds or services (such as mailing lists or office equipment) directly to candidates or political committees.
- Allow the distribution of material that favors any one candidate or political party.
- Pay fees for political events from church funds.
- Set up a political committee that would contribute funds directly to political candidates.
- No candidate should be allowed to solicit funds while speaking at a church.

## Voter Registration Form

Please read instructions carefully.

#### **Eligibility**

You are qualified to register to vote in Ohio if you meet all the following requirements:

- 1. You are a citizen of the United States.
- 2. You will be at least 18 years old on or before the day of the general election.
- 3. You will be a resident of Ohio for at least 30 days immediately before the election in which you want to vote.
- 4. You are not incarcerated (in prison) for a felony conviction.
- 5. You have not been declared incompetent for voting purposes by a probate court.
- You have not been permanently disfranchised for violations of the election laws.

**Use this form to** register to vote *or* update your current Ohio registration if you have changed your address or name.

**NOTICE:** Your registration or change must be *received or postmarked* by the 30th day before an election at which you intend to vote. You will be notified by your county board of elections of the location where you vote. If you do not receive a notice prior to election day, call your county board of elections.

**Lines 1 and 2 are required by law.** If you do not answer *both* of the questions, your registration will not be processed.

#### **Registering in Person**

If you have a current valid Ohio driver's license, you must provide that number on line 10. If you do not have an Ohio driver's license, you must provide the *last four digits* of your social security number on line 10. If you have neither, write "None."

#### Registering by Mail

If you register by mail and do not provide either a current Ohio driver's license number or the last four digits of your Social Security number, please enclose a copy of one of the following forms of identification with your registration application:

• Current valid photo identification card, military identification, current utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check or government document (except board of elections' notifications) showing your name and current address.

#### **Your Signature**

Your registration cannot be processed without your signature. On line 14, affix your signature or mark taking care that it does not touch surrounding lines of type. If your signature is a mark, include the name and address of the person who witnessed the mark beneath the signature line. If by reason of disability you are unable to physically sign, the attorney-in-fact that you have appointed pursuant to R.C. 3501.382, may sign this form on your behalf at your direction and in your presence.

#### **Person Registering Applicant**

Complete line 15 if you will receive compensation for providing this registration form, assisting in completing the form, or returning this form. As a compensated registrant, you must return this form to an office of a county board of elections or the secretary of state's office.

See voter identification requirements for voting. Please type or print clearly with a black pen. Affix copy of ID.
